## World day for prevention of child abuse Observed

Walk against Child Labour in Bhubaneswar City

19<sup>th</sup> November is being observed as the "World day for prevention of child abuse" all over the world. Child abuse is a major cause of concern, which creates barrier for free growth of children. Adding to different form of exploitation, exclusion issues have played major role in damaging the child hood of millions of children. Violence against children takes many forms i.e Child labour, child trafficking, Corporal punishment, sale of children, sexual abuse, child prostitution, neglect, child sex tourism, malnutrition, bullying, child pornography, harmful traditional practices, abduction, early and forced marriage etc.

Atleast 3 of every 4 of the world's children have experienced violence .**Child labour is one of the worst forms of violence against children.** The ILO's Statistical Information and Monitoring Program on Child Labor recently estimated that 211 million children, or 18 % of children aged 5-14, are economically active worldwide. 60% of these working children live in Asia, and 23% live in sub-Saharan Africa. Most economically active children are employed in agriculture.

Child labor not only negatively affects a child's health, but it also negatively impacts his/her ability to receive schooling and perform academically. When children are forced by their families to work, they no longer have the time to attend school. Though there are a significant number of children who go to school and work, the work may negatively impact their studies, told by many eminent dignitaries while addressing a programme held here today to mark the occasion.

To mark the occasion a "Walk against child labour", From Ram Mandir Square to Master canteen Square and Signature campaign and Street Play near Master Canteen Square were organized by People's Cultural Centre (PECUC) a leading child rights organization in collaboration with the Labour & ESI Department, Govt. Of Odisha. Chairperson of Odisha Building and Other Construction Workers' Welfare Board Sj. Subash Singh and Famous Ollywood Actress Archita Sahoo inaugurated the walk and signature campaign.
